THE DATABASE

Police departments receiving federal grant funds may lose those funds if they discriminate based on race, national origin, disability or other characteristics. Yet, some departments have paid out millions in local funds to resolve claims of police misconduct involving people of color, and others have entered into consent decrees with the Department of Justice to address discriminatory policing. Using the database, communities can compare data on grants, settlements, and decrees to support demands for accountability by local law enforcement.

WHY IT MATTERS


DISCRIMINATION

Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 prohibits discrimination on the basis of race, color, and national origin by recipients of federal funding. Law enforcement agencies that violate Title VI by discriminating against Black communities, for example, risk losing their federal funds.


MISCONDUCT SETTLEMENTS & CONSENT DECREES

Many police departments receiving federal grant funds have paid out millions to resolve claims of police misconduct and others have entered into consent decrees with the Department of Justice. Using the database, communities can compare data on grants, settlements, and decrees to support demands for accountability by local law enforcement.
